Teaching Knowledge Test: CLIL

Content and language integrated learning

TKT: CLIL is a test of professional knowledge of concepts related to a CLIL approach. It is for English language teachers and also content teachers who use English as a medium for teaching their curriculum subject(s).

TKT: CLIL consists of two parts.

Part 1 Knowledge of CLIL and Principles of CLIL focuses on candidates' knowledge of

- · aims of and rationale for CLIL
- · language across the curriculum
- · communication skills across the curriculum
- · cognitive skills across the curriculum
- · learning skills across the curriculum

Part 2 Lesson Preparation focuses on candidates' knowledge of

- · planning a lesson and a series of lessons
- · language demands of subject content and accompanying tasks
- · resources, including multimedia and visual organisers
- · materials selection and adaptation
- · activity types

Lesson Delivery focuses on candidates' knowledge of

- · classroom language
- · scaffolding content and language learning
- · methods to help students develop learning strategies
- · consolidating learning and differentiation

Assessment focuses on candidates' knowledge of

- · focus of assessment
- · types of assessment
- · support strategies for assessment

Performance bands

TKT: CLIL results are reported in four bands. There is no pass/fail. A typical candidate at this level demonstrates;

- Band 1 limited knowledge of TKT: CLIL content areas
- Band 2 basic but systematic knowledge of TKT: CLIL content areas breadth and depth of knowledge of TKT: CLIL content areas
- Band 4 extensive knowledge of TKT: CLIL content areas

Any alteration to this certificate renders it invalid and use of an altered certificate could constitute a criminal offence.
