INTERNATIONAL RECOGNITION AND GLOBAL RANKINGS PERFORMANCE

In the 2024–2025 academic year, Khoja Akhmet Yassawi International Kazakh-Turkish University reaffirmed its status as a leader in Kazakhstan's higher education, maintaining its position among the Top 10 universities in the country while achieving significant growth in global rankings.

Advancement in Asia (QS Asia University Rankings 2026)

According to the QS Asia University Rankings 2026, released on November 4, 2025, the university rose to 184th place in Asia, up from 193rd in 2025. Over the past four years, the university has shown consistent upward mobility—from 239th in 2023 to 184th in 2026—confirming the success of its strategic focus on internationalization, academic excellence, and educational quality.

Core growth drivers this year include:

- **Academic Reputation:** Increased recognition from regional researchers and peers.
- **International Appeal:** Growth in the share of international students and faculty.
- **Learning Environment:** Maintaining an optimal student-to-faculty ratio.
- **Global Mobility:** Expanding academic exchanges and international partnerships.

Global Market Breakthrough (QS World University Rankings 2026)

The university also surged in the QS World University Rankings 2026, jumping over 80 positions from 848th (in 2025) to the 761–770 range. This leap underscores the university's rising competitiveness on the global stage.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT AND CORPORATE CULTURE

During the 2024–2025 academic year, the university focused on enhancing the professional competencies of its leadership through strategic educational projects and new internal communication formats.

Strategic Partnership: "Academic Leadership Institute: Deans' School"

A key milestone was the joint project with Nazarbayev University — the "Academic Leadership Institute: Deans' School" program.

- **Timeline:** On November 14, 2024, the 4th and 5th modules were held at the Nazarbayev University Graduate School of Education in Astana.
- **Digital Transformation:** On October 10, 2024, our university hosted the "Digitalization of Education" module.
- **Focus:** The initiative aims at the professional development of deans, focusing on modern management and digital integration.

Internal Communications: Corporate Breakfasts

To foster teamwork, the "Corporate Breakfast" format was introduced.

- **Details:** Sessions take place every Tuesday from 9:00 to 10:00 AM.
- **Participants:** Deans, heads of departments, directors of research institutes, and vice-deans.
- **Objective:** Professional development and team building among senior management.

In the 2024–2025 academic year, the university maintained its focus on modernizing management processes and enhancing the professional growth of its academic and administrative staff.

The partnership with **Nazarbayev University** through the "Academic Leadership Institute: Deans' School" program remained a cornerstone of leadership training.

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- **On-site Training:** On October 10, 2024, our university hosted the "Digitalization of Education" module to integrate modern digital tools into management.
- **Regional Collaboration:** On November 14, 2024, the 4th and 5th modules were conducted at the Nazarbayev University Graduate School of Education in Astana.

New Communication Models: Corporate Breakfasts

To foster a collaborative environment, the "**Corporate Breakfast**" initiative was launched.

- **Schedule:** Sessions are held every Tuesday from 9:00 AM to 10:00 AM.
- **Participants:** Deans, department heads, research institute directors, and vice-deans.

III Yasawi Winter School

The **III Yasawi Winter School** was held from January 8 to January 22, 2025, serving as a comprehensive training platform.

- **Outcome:** The program effectively strengthened internal cooperation and updated the skill sets of faculty and staff.

 - PhD: 120 students.
 - Residency: 861 students.

The university demonstrates impressive growth in the academic activity and competitiveness of its learners. There is a steady positive trend in the number of students winning prizes in subject olympiads, as well as in national and international competitions (excluding sports achievements).

Growth dynamics by academic year:

- **2020/2021:** 27 students.
- **2021/2022:** 39 students.
- **2022/2023:** 77 students.
- **2023/2024:** 81 students.
- **2024/2025:** 135 students.

Over the past five years, the number of winners in intellectual competitions has increased fivefold, confirming the high level of academic excellence and student motivation.

STUDENT SUCCESS IN THE NATIONAL SUBJECT OLYMPIAD

Students of our university have once again demonstrated their academic excellence by becoming winners and prize-winners of the National Subject Olympiad.

- **Event Scale:** This year, the Ministry of Science and Higher Education of the Republic of Kazakhstan organized the traditional XVII National Student Subject Olympiad.
- **Participation:** Students from our university actively participated in this intellectual competition across several educational programs.
- **Results:** Following the competition, the students displayed outstanding preparation and achieved high results in various disciplines.

ADMISSION RESULTS FOR THE 2025–2026 ACADEMIC YEAR

In the current academic year, the university's admission rates have shown significant growth, confirming high standards of education and the institution's rising prestige.

- **General Indicators:** A total of **2,874 students** were enrolled across Bachelor's, Master's, PhD, and Residency programs.
- **Growth Dynamics:** Compared to the previous year, enrollment increased by **16.3%**.
- **Enrollment by Level (as of 2025):**
 - **Bachelor's:** 1,091 students.

- **Residency:** 180 students.
- **Doctorate:** 26 students.

DIGITALIZATION OF EDUCATION AND PARTNERSHIP WITH COURSERA (BMG UPSKILL)

As part of its academic development, the university actively integrates online courses from leading global institutions (Yale, Manchester, University of Virginia, etc.) via the Coursera platform.

Statistics for Student Licenses:

- **2023–2024 Academic Year:** 650 licenses issued. Students mastered over 300 courses and received 3,685 certificates.
- **2024–2025 Academic Year:** Licenses increased to 900. Registered for nearly 50 courses, with 9,188 certificates obtained. The completion rate for at least one course rose by 1008.4%.

Statistics for Faculty Licenses (Teaching Staff):

- **2023–2024 Academic Year:** 152 licenses issued. Registered for nearly 40 courses, with 353 certificates obtained.

As part of its 2024–2025 development strategy, the university has significantly accelerated the implementation of advanced educational technologies and strengthened its position in Kazakhstan's academic landscape.

Integration of Global Expertise: Coursera Project (BMG UpSkill)

The university actively incorporates online courses from world-renowned institutions such as Yale, Manchester, and Nanyang Technological University via the Coursera platform.

- **Students:** For the 2024–2025 academic year, the number of licenses increased to **900**. The total number of certificates earned reached **9,188**, with the completion rate for at least one course surging by **1008.4%**.
- **Faculty:** The teaching staff also showed remarkable progress. With 50 active licenses, faculty members obtained **610 certificates**, reflecting a **222.1%** increase in course completion efficiency.

Regional Leadership: AI-SANA Project

Khoja Akhmet Yassawi International Kazakh-Turkish University has been officially recognized as one of the **27 pivotal regional universities** participating in the **AI-SANA** project. This status reaffirms the university's role as a leading intellectual hub in Southern Kazakhstan, driving the development of AI and digital competencies.

PARTICIPATION IN STRATEGIC STATE PROJECTS (AI-SANA)

Khoja Akhmet Yassawi International Kazakh-Turkish University has officially joined the ranks of the country's leading higher education institutions participating in the national artificial intelligence development initiative.

- **Status:** The university is recognized as one of the **27 pivotal regional higher education institutions** designated as project sites for the **AI-SANA** program.
- **Mission:** This inclusion reaffirms the university's role as a primary driver of digital transformation and innovative development in the southern region of Kazakhstan.

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE "AI-SANA" PROGRAM IN ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE

Following the Address of President K. Tokayev dated September 8, 2025, the "AI-SANA" program was launched to train 100,000 students in high-tech projects. The university is actively involved in the following strategic stages:

Implementation Stages and Key Focus Areas:

- **Main Stage:** Organizing training courses on AI fundamentals via **Coursera, HUAWEL, ASTANA HUB, and GOOGLE**.
- **First Stage:** Professional skills training, AI-based programming, and machine learning.
- **Goal:** Achieving 100% basic AI competence among all students and academic staff.

- **2025 Outlook:** Project acceleration and the development of 5 additional AI agents by the end of 2025.

LIBRARY COLLECTION — STATISTICS AND MODERNIZATION

The university prioritizes the development of information resources, ensuring an annual increase in the book collection and significant funding for its update.

Statistical Indicators and Funding:

- **Funding Dynamics:** There is a substantial increase in investments in the library fund. While funding in 2020–2021 was **33,642,600 tenge**, by 2024–2025 it increased to **45,521,458 tenge**.
- **Total Book Collection:** The total number of items in the fund is consistently maintained at a high level. In the 2024–2025 reporting period, the total number of books reached **523,119 units**.

Annual Update Indicators:

The university purchases new academic and scientific literature every year:

- **2020–2021:** 3,717 new books.
- **2021–2022:** 4,383 new books.
- **2022–2023:** 3,877 new books.
- **2023–2024:** 2,820 new books.
- **2024–2025:** A record addition of **7,309 new copies**.

SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH AND PERSONNEL ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY

During the reporting period, the university demonstrated significant growth in scientific activity and a qualitative strengthening of its staff.

Grant Funding and Competitions:

- **Total Funding:** Based on the results of competitions for 2025–2027, the total amount of attracted funds reached **1,229,535,606 tenge**.
- **Competition Results (2025–2027):**

- The university operates **1 Dissertation Council** for training teachers in natural sciences (specialization: Physics).

Between 2021 and 2025, the university demonstrated an impressive growth trend in scientific activity and the volume of investments attracted for research projects.

Dynamics of Research Projects (2021–2025)

The number of projects approved by the National Science Council has been steadily increasing:

- **2021–2022:** 18 projects.
- **2025:** 40 projects.

Financial Performance

The total funding for scientific projects over 5 years has increased more than tenfold:

- **Total funding (as of 2025):** reached **8.8 billion tenge**.
- **Annual funding:** rose from 216 million tenge in 2021 to **4 billion tenge** in 2025.

2025–2027 Competition Results

Based on recent competition results, the total attracted funding amounted to **1,229,535,606 tenge**. Breakdown of projects:

- **Grant funding:** 8 projects.
- **Young Scientists competition:** 2 projects.
- **Program-targeted financing:** 1 project.

COMMERCIALIZATION OF SCIENTIFIC ACTIVITIES

From 2021 to 2025, the university has demonstrated steady growth in income from the commercialization of scientific research.

- **Total Revenue:** During this period, the total amount of income reached **214,945,752 tenge**.
- **Annual Growth Dynamics:**
 - **2021:** 27 million tenge.
 - **2022:** 19 million tenge.
 - **2023:** 37 million tenge.
 - **2024:** Peak performance — **67 million tenge**.
 - **2025:** 63 million tenge.

These indicators confirm the successful integration of science and business, as well as the market demand for the university's innovative developments.

LABORATORY INFRASTRUCTURE AND E-LABS DEVELOPMENT

During the 2024–2025 academic year, the university significantly modernized its research facilities to achieve academic excellence and support applied sciences. The total investment in cutting-edge equipment reached **230,811,404 tenge**.

Key Achievements in 2024:

- **New Facilities:** Launched the "New Materials for Nanotechnology and Energy" research lab, the "STEM and Creativity" teaching lab, and a solar power station.
- **Research Excellence Center:** Established fundamental laboratories for microbiological, molecular, and clinical diagnostics, cell biology, and pathomorphology.

Strategic Analysis for 2025:

The university's infrastructure is evolving toward high-tech interdisciplinary hubs. Plans for 2025 include:

- **AI Research Lab** for advanced artificial intelligence studies.
- **BigData** laboratory in clinical medicine.
- A laboratory for **IoT** (Internet of Things) and industrial technology research.
- New centers for immunology, plant physiology, and biotechnology.

IMPLEMENTATION OF INNOVATIVE PROJECTS — GREEN ENERGY

As part of the university's commitment to environmental initiatives and sustainable infrastructure, a solar power plant has been commissioned on the campus.

- **Technical Specifications:** The total capacity of the installed solar station is **30 kW**.

- **Project Goals:** The facility was established to promote green energy and provide the campus with renewable energy sources.
- **Educational and Research Foundation:** The station was constructed under the grant project titled "Development of research and engineering activities of students based on the implementation of STEM projects in the field of solar energy".

This project enables students to develop practical engineering skills and conduct scientific research in the field of alternative energy.

SCIENTIFIC PUBLICATION ACTIVITY AND AUTHOR INCENTIVES

As part of the strategy to enhance the university's international scientific reputation, systematic efforts to support authors of scientific publications and patents continued during the 2024–2025 academic year. As of September 15, 2026, key indicators show steady growth in both the number of publications and the volume of allocated incentive funds.

1. Analysis of Publications in International Databases (Scopus and Web of Science)

Between 2021 and 2025, university scholars published a total of 1,066 scientific articles in journals indexed by Scopus and Web of Science (WOS) (data as of January 29, 2026).

Dynamics of Scopus publications:

- **2021:** 145 articles.
- **2022:** 132 articles.
- **2023:** 157 articles.
- **2024:** 221 articles.
- **2025:** 239 articles.
- **Web of Science Publications:** Interest in high-ranking journals in this database remains stable, peaking at 23 articles in 2023.

2. Financial Incentives for Authors The university annually increases the budget for rewarding authors for publications in impact-factor journals and patent registrations, serving as a powerful driver for research activity.

Dynamics of allocated funds:

- **2020:** The total payment amounted to 1.5 million tenge.
- **2024:** Funding volume rose to 19.7 million tenge.
- **2025:** A record 29.4 million tenge was directed toward author incentives.

The observed growth in Scopus publications (a nearly 1.7-fold increase compared to 2021) directly correlates with the surge in financial incentives for researchers. A more than 19-fold expansion of the incentive fund over the last 5 years has facilitated the transition of research quantity into qualitative indicators of international recognition. This practice fully aligns with the university's goals of becoming a leading research center and contributes to improving the institution's standing in global rankings such as the QS World University Rankings.

SCIENTIFIC AND EDUCATIONAL EVENTS

During the reporting period, the university carried out extensive work in organizing scientific discussions and socially significant events aimed at developing the potential of students and staff.

Scientific Events:

- **International Conferences and Congresses:** 18 events.
- **National (Republican) Conferences and Congresses:** 13 events.
- **Scientific Seminars:** 125 sessions.
- **Teleconferences:** 14 sessions.
- **Round Tables:** 40 discussions.

Educational and Social Activities:

- **Spiritual and Moral Education:** 12 events.
- **Legal Education:** 13 events.

- **Healthy Lifestyle Promotion:** 12 events.
- **National Holidays of Turkic Peoples:** 11 events.
- **Environmental Education:** 8 events.
- **National-Patriotic Education:** 15 events.
- **Personal Development and Leadership/Speaker Skills for Youth:** 6 events.

International Academic Relations and Cultural Initiatives

The university has significantly strengthened its position as a hub for international scientific, educational, and cultural dialogue within the Turkic world.

- **International Academic Cooperation:**
 - The university hosted the 2nd Joint Senate Meeting with the Kyrgyz-Turkish Manas University.
 - Rector Zhanar Temirbekova held strategic meetings with rectors from Karadeniz Technical University, Gazi University, and Recep Tayyip Erdoğan University to discuss joint projects and student academic mobility.
 - Thirteen professors and teachers from the university participated in the "Manas-Yassawi" summer school in Kyrgyzstan.
- **Scientific and Practical Conferences:**
 - An international conference titled "The Turkic World: Traditions, Experience, and Future Prospects of Electoral Systems" was held with high-level delegations from various Turkic nations.
 - The symposium "II Kazakh Language – The Language of Science: Artificial Intelligence and Terminology" was conducted from April 2 to April 4, 2025.
- **Cultural and Expert Projects:**
 - The musical drama "A Thousand Ages – One Turkistan" was staged as part of the international symposium.
 - Expert platforms included workshops on "International Scientific Diplomacy" and "A Unified Approach to Terminology in the Kazakh Language," as well as plenary and sectional sessions.

International Academic Relations and Experience Exchange

- The university hosted the 2nd Joint Senate Meeting with the Kyrgyz-Turkish Manas University.
- Rector Zhanar Temirbekova held strategic meetings with the rectors of Gazi University (Ugur Unal), Karadeniz Technical University (Hamdullah Cuvalci), and Recep Tayyip Erdoğan University (Yusuf Yilmaz) to discuss joint projects and academic mobility.
- Thirteen professors and teachers participated in the "Manas-Yassawi" summer school in Kyrgyzstan.
- With the support of the Board of Trustees, 31 faculty members traveled to Ankara, Turkey, for an experience exchange program.
- Forty top-performing students participated in the "Yassawi Turkology Summer School – 2025," visiting historical cities and institutions in Turkey.

Memorandums and Cooperation

- A memorandum was signed following a meeting with Elvira Azimova, Chairperson of the Constitutional Court.
- A cooperation agreement was established with Aktoty Raimkulova, President of the International Turkic Culture and Heritage Foundation.
- Mutual cooperation memorandums were signed with Tashkent State Transport University and the National Academy of Sciences of the Republic of Kazakhstan under the President of the RK.

New Initiatives and Infrastructure

- The "Future Prosecutor Space" was officially opened at the university.
- The Turar Ryskulov Alley was inaugurated, and a sycamore tree planting event was held to mark the 30th anniversary of the Maslikhats of the Republic of Kazakhstan.
- A consultative platform and alley for the Central Election Bodies of the OTS member states were established.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND NEW INITIATIVES

The university has significantly expanded its technical facilities and launched several socially significant projects.

- **Engineering and AI:** A modern laboratory for **40 students** was opened with **TIKA** support. Additionally, an **Artificial Intelligence laboratory** (10 seats) was launched for research in machine learning and digital image processing.
- **Faculty of Philology:** New facilities include the **Seithali Maduanuly** auditorium (30 seats), the **Professor Rahmankul Berdibay** conference hall (120 seats), and the **Professor Saparbek Yergobek** auditorium.
- **Social Spaces:** The university opened the "**Future Prosecutor Space**," the **Turar Ryskulov Alley**, and an alley for the OTS Central Election Bodies. A sycamore planting event marked the 30th anniversary of the Maslikhats of the RK.

SECTION: STRATEGIC MEMORANDUMS

The university strengthened its partnerships by signing cooperation agreements with:

- **Elvira Azimova**, Chairperson of the Constitutional Court of the RK.
- **Aktoty Raimkulova**, President of the International Turkic Culture and Heritage Foundation.
- **Tashkent State Transport University.**
- **National Academy of Sciences of the RK** under the President of the RK.

The university hosted several key events: conferences commemorating the 120th anniversary of N. Ondasynov and the 190th anniversary of Sh. Ualikhanov, the II International Turkic World Engineers Summit, and seminars on counter-terrorism and digital education.

"Yasawi Endowment" Public Fund

On October 30, 2024, during the II Alumni Forum, the "Yasawi Endowment" public fund was officially launched following an initiative by the university's graduates. The fund is led by its founders: M. Asanova, a 1996 graduate and Executive Director-Coordinator of the Alumni Association, and E. Tolegenov, a 2000 graduate and the university's Vice-Rector. The establishment of the fund marked the beginning of a charitable fundraising process, with the first contribution provided by the class of 1995 on the launch day. Furthermore, on December 29, 2024, an official memorandum of cooperation was signed between Akhmet Yasawi University and the "Yasawi Endowment" public fund during a Senate meeting.

International Events Dedicated to Turkic Civilization The university organized the II International Symposium "Monuments of Turkic Civilization: Methods of Study, Preservation, and Restoration". Within the symposium, the grand opening of the exhibition "Language — the Source of Virtue" was held, dedicated to the 950th anniversary of Mahmud al-Kashgari's "Dīwān Lughāt al-Turk".

Sporting Achievements and Victory in the Universiade The university emerged as the winner of the XIII Summer Universiade. In the 2024-2025 academic year, student-athletes won a total of 202 medals: 76 gold, 53 silver, and 73 bronze. These achievements span World and Asian Championships (22 medals), RK Championships (69 medals), international competitions (34 medals), and the XIII Summer Universiade (77 medals).
